IFPTOHE Chair Update 2022-23

The Executive Committee has been busy and is working well together as a progressive team. Our activities over the past year have been diverse. In brief, they have included but are not limited to:

- Being involved in the Lighten the Load campaign
- Working towards developing global practice/ competency standards
- Reviewing a new guidelines from The World Health Organsiation on Mental Health at Work
- Hosting webinars as continuing education sessions
- Developing a revised governance document to update our existing IFPTOHE Constitution
- Each of these projects are described in more detail in this report.

Name change and New Governance Document

Our name is changing from IFPTOHE to IFPOHE (from physical therapy to physiotherapy) to align with the new name of World Physiotherapy. We will start using the new name at the IFPOHE General Meeting on May 16th this year.

World Physiotherapy has been working with subgroups to develop a new governance document to replace their existing constitution, and provided a suggested template for subgroups to follow. This was adapted, with minimal changes, to suit the anticipated future needs of IFPOHE. It was shared with Member Organisations early in 2023, seeking their feedback. Following this consultation process, the new Governance document will be voted on prior to the upcoming General Meeting.

EU-OSHA 'Lighten the Load' Campaign

In 2020 IFPTOHE decided to apply to become an official campaign partner of the EU-OSHA 'Lighten the load' campaign regarding prevention and management of work-related musculoskeletal disorders. In 2021 IFPTOHE was accepted as a campaign partner. On the Healthy-Workplaces EU website you can find the IFPTOHE mission statement and campaign pledge.

By becoming a campaign partner our first aim was to support our fourteen European Member Organisations with their contribution towards the improvement of the health and wellbeing of their national workforce through supporting, developing and promoting the practice of Physiotherapists working in Occupational Health and Ergonomics. The second aim was to share the resources with the wider profession. An IFPTOHE 'working together webinar' was dedicated to this theme in November 2021 (see webinars).

IFPTOHE's Vice President (Yvonne de Leeuw-van Zaanen) who led partnership with the campaign was invited to a webinar about the Lighten the Load campaign of the European Region of World Physiotherapy (as campaign partner) in April 2022. The title of their webinar was: A healthy workforce, cost effective options to tackle musculoskeletal disorders (MSDs) in telework.

IFPTOHE was invited by EU-OSHA to give a statement at the closing summary of the campaign in November 2022, Bilbao, Spain. This presented a wonderful opportunity to profile our profession in a parallel session 2 - Working with chronic MSDs (at 1:26 hour:minutes) which was reported back as one of the main findings at the closing plenary session (at 22:10 you can find Prof. Anthony Woolf referring to our presentation regarding timely and probably more tailored advice for workers with MSDs)

After the campaign had ended, our executive committee member Vasiliki Sakellari was given the opportunity to present campaign materials and findings in Pretoria, South Africa through an (European) Erasmus+ support for teaching in higher education abroad (February 2023).

Please note that all campaign materials remain in place at the EU-OSHA website and the next campaign from 2023 – 2025 will focus on 'Safe and healthy work in the digital age'.

Development of Global Competency Standards

Working towards setting global standards is an ambitious project which is currently underway. Over the past six months a number of keen volunteers have worked collaboratively on this. To suit varied world times there are two groups. WHO Mental Health at Work Guidelines

Early in 2022, our chair Rose Boucaut was involved in reviewing the WHO mental health at work guidelines. Consequently, a connection between IFPTOHE and the World Physiotherapy Mental Health group was made which will lead to a joint IFPTOHE-Mental Health seminar at the Dubai 2023 congress.

Education/Webinars

IFPTOHE has established a regular 'Working Together Webinar' series. These webinars have been popular amongst our member organisations and those interested in work and health. The webinars aim to educate and inform attendees, bringing our community together to discuss topics on work and health.
